The authors are invited to submit original research work on the themes mentioned above. The abstract should be MS word types and should not exceed 200-250 words, excluding title, author/s name and affiliation (Format single spacing; Times New Roman; 12 font size). The content of the abstract should clearly state the background, objectives, method, results, and conclusions including 3-5 keywords.

NOTE: Out of the submitted abstracts, 25 best abstracts will be selected to submit their full paper within a week. Research papers should be in Hindi or English language only. All selected papers' presenters shall read their full paper in the conference. Minimum 20 minutes time shall be given to all participants to read their paper.

The full paper should have maximum limit of 12-15-A4 sized Pages APA 7th edition format only including:
