This MoU is entered on the 07<sup>th</sup>day of November 2023 by and between

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, India, Gorakhpur (U.P.) (Hereinafter called DDUGU) situated at Gorakhpur (U.P.).

and

India Glycols Limited (hereinafter called IGL) situated at Gida, Gorakhpur (Uttar Pradesh), a leading company that manufactures green technology grain-based ethanol ,DDGS(ingredients of animal & poultry feed). Power export, SDS ,and Portable liquor.

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University. established in 1957 by the Uttar Pradesh State Universities Act), is the first University to be established in Uttar Pradesh after Independence. In its long eventful journey, it has constantly striven to live up to its motto, "Let noble thoughts come to me from all directions" by assimilating diverse ideas, people, and beliefs into its academic and co-curricular lives. Spread over 190.96 acres, it houses seven Faculties comprising of forty departments that have been playing a significant role in imparting holistic education predominantly to the people of the Eastern region of Uttar Pradesh, Western Bihar, and the neighboring country of Nepal since its inception. The University is acclaimed nationwide for conducting and promoting quality research, exceptional teaching and learning processes, national and international awardees, sports activities and recognitions, engagement in outreach and extension activities, robust student support system, placements in reputed government and private organizations, and transparent and effective governance. The University, is equipped with facilities like an automated Central Library, ICT-enabled classrooms, state-of-the-art laboratories, an Incubation center, Health Centre, separate hostels for then and women, facilities for sports and games, an environmentally friendly campus, gender-sensitive ambiance and ragging- free atmosphere. Hereafter referred to as the "FIRST PARTY".

plant in 1983. Since then, IGL has brought together cutting-edge technology, innovation and an unflagging commitment to quality, to manufacture a wide range of products that have found global demand.

IGL's state-of-the-art, integrated facilities manufacture chemicals including glycols, ethoxylates, glycol ethers and acetates, and various performance chemicals. Its product range spans the chemicals, spirits, herbal and other phytochemical extracts and guar gum, industrial gases and realty sectors, and finds application across an increasing number of industries. These products are manufactured in compliance with stringent global standards of plant operations, quality and safety. The company's facilities have been approved and certified by international agencies including Det Norske Veritas (DNV). The operations at all plants are closely monitored through distributed control systems (DCS), which facilitate a high degree of control over the quality of products.

Keeping in mind the critical dependence on agricultural feedstock, the company has taken up several initiatives including backward integration into sugar manufacturing to ensure seamless raw material availability. Other complementary initiatives include co-opting the cane growing community to ensure cane availability while providing adequate returns to the farmer. In the interest of establishing a relationship of mutual benefit to both organizations, Deen Bayal Dpadhyaya Gorakhpur Universityand India Glycols Limited, Gida, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh (IGL) have agreed to the areas of collaboration on academic, entrepreneurship and research related activities as mentioned in this MoU.

## 1. Objectives:

- 1.2 To strengthen collaboration between DDUGU and IGL, Gorakhpur, through academic programmes in instruction, research-oriented, and faculty development programmes among the faculty and students of both parties.
- 1.3 Joint or collaborative research projects and publications.
- 1.4 Promoting collaboration in various academic activities.
- 1.5 Extending help in increasing the placement of students and consultancy projects.
- 1.6 To encourage research and executing patents on mutually agreed terms.
- 1.7 To jointly organize technical meetings, international/national workshops, conferences, seminars, staff development programmes, training programmes, symposia, etc.

## 2. Scope/Area of collaboration:

The Scope of collaboration on academic and research activities in this Memorandum of Understanding includes the following categories:

- 1. Exchange of academic and industrial information, materials, and facilities
- 2. Faculty and Staff Exchange
- 3. Intellectual property rights of the collaboration work belonging to both parties
- 4. Developing articulations for twinning/joint programs and allowing students to undertake part of the programme / course of study at each organization
- 5. To implement a Continuing Education Programme to improve quality of teaching and staff of DDUGU through short-term/long-term certificate courses at IGL and vice versa. Faculty members/Staff of IGL could also be sent to DDUGU for necessary guidance and vice versa.

To provide academic interaction by delivering Special Lectures at DDUGU and IGL on the topics of modern industry, start-ups, skill India, digital India, ommunity development etc.

Drganizing joint Workshops/Conferences and Personality/Professional Development Programmes for enhancement of skills to Faculty, Staff and Students.

8. To provide necessary support for establishment of Video Satellite link and assistance in development of e-Classrooms, Lab, Curriculum, Establishment of Research Labs, Training and Placement and Library etc. at DDUGU.

9. To facilitate the training for teachers, staff and students.

- 10. Guidance for enhancement in infrastructural & skill development of DDUGU.
- 11. Doing the joint International and National sponsored consultancy projects in the areas of mutual interest.
- 12. Promoting such other activities/programs as mutually agreed from time to time

Both the organizations shall encourage co-operation in any discipline and programme offered at either University as well as in further areas of cooperation which are felt to promote the above-mentioned objectives and areas of collaboration. However, any specific bilateral programme shall be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds and the approval of both the institutions.

A specific plan will be worked out by the organizations/institutions depending upon availability of resources.

### 3. Terms and Conditions

- a) For continuing education to DDUGU teachers, staff and students, the financial arrangements will be made on mutually agreed terms and conditions.
- b) For the visit related to advice and consultancy, travel, and other expenses of IGL Faculty and Staff shall be reimbursed on mutually agreed terms and vice versa.
- c) The faculty members and students of DDUGU can use the Laboratory facility of IGL for short-time free of cost, as per the norms of IGL and vice versa.
- d) Usage of IGL infrastructure for Lab/Workshop/Hands-on Training etc. can be allowed for limited period subject to its availability and approval of Head of the department (Business Head) as per organization norms.
- e) Both organizations agree to help, identify and invite the faculty members and researchers from the other institutions to participate in conferences/seminars/symposia, workshops, short-term courses, and training programmes.
- This Mou may be amended, renewed, and terminated by mutual written agreement of the organizations at any time.
- g) Either Institution shall have the right to terminate this MoU upon 60 days prior written notice to the other institution/organization.

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- a) The DDUGU and IGL agree to hold in confidence all information/data designated by the institutions as being confidential which is obtained from either institution or created during the performance of the MoU and will not disclose the same to any third party without written consent of the other institution/organization.
- b) The above confidentiality clause under this MoU excludes the information/data possessed by either institution/ organization before entering this MoU or independently developed and/or information already available through the public domain.

## 5. Duration of MoU

This MoU, unless extended by mutual written consent of the institutions, shall expire in Three years after the effective date specified in the opening paragraph. However, on review, the MoU can be extended for another two years by mutual consent.

#### 6. Coordinators

Both organizations will designate persons who will have responsibility for the coordination and implementation of this agreement.

## 7. Intellectual Property Rights

The Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) that arise as a result of joint research and collaborative activity under the agreement will be worked out on a case-to-case basis and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two institutions.

### 8. Indemnity

DDUGU and IGL shall remain indemnified in case of any injury caused during training programmes or other activities due to any faulty protocol etc.

Both DRUCU and IGL agree to the above principles subject to the completion of such other formalities required by university bodies including the approval of the Competent Authority under relevant Acts and Statutes

# sh Force Majeure

Neither institution/ organization shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this agreement due to exigency of one or more of the force respective events such as but not limited to Acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquakes, Strikes, No tapekouts, Epidemics, Riots, Civil Commotion, etc., provided on the occurrence and cessation

of any such events, the institution effected thereby shall give notice in writing to the other institution within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the force majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the institutions/ organization shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

## 10. Resolution of Dispute

- a) Any dispute between the institution/organization arising in connection with the performance of this MoU shall be resolved amicably between the institution/organization through a process of negotiation by the representatives of both the organization.
- b) In the dispute is not resolved, then it shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor / Registrar of DDUGU and Business Head of IGL for settlement. Even then, if any issue still remains unresolved, then it shall be referred to the Arbitrator who shall be appointed with the consent of both the institutions. The seat of the Arbitrator shall be at Gorakhpur and proceedings shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.

## 11. Signed in Duplicate

This MoU is executed in duplicate with each copy being an official version and having equal legal validity. By signing below, the institution/ organization, acting by their duly authorized officers, have caused this Memorandum of Understanding to be executed, effective as of the day and year first written above.
